Employee Giving

Edison International conducts an annual employee contributions drive offering numerous options for workers to pledge their support to local charities. In 2009, more than 7,000 employees participated, donating more than \$4.1 million to schools and nonprofit organizations. Over the past ten years, employees have provided \$40 million in support of community causes.

Employee Volunteerism



Edison employees are active contributors in their communities generously sharing their time, skills and energy as volunteers in the neighborhoods and communities where they live and work. In 2009, employees and retirees volunteered more than 252,500 hours to organizations including churches, schools, parks, women's shelters, food banks and various youth programs.

Green Jobs Education Initiative



Southern California Edison (SCE), a subsidiary of Edison International, funded a \$1 million Green Jobs Education Initiative in 2010. It provided grants of \$100,000 to each of these ten California community colleges: Cerritos College, Cerro Coso Community College, El Camino College, Golden West College, Long Beach City College, L.A. Southwest College, L.A. Trade-Technical College, Rio Hondo College, San Bernardino Valley College and Ventura College.

The grants will fund scholarships for students enrolled in green jobs education and training programs. This includes the study of renewable energy generation, green building and energy efficiency, transportation and alternative fuels, and biofuels production. Computer Donations

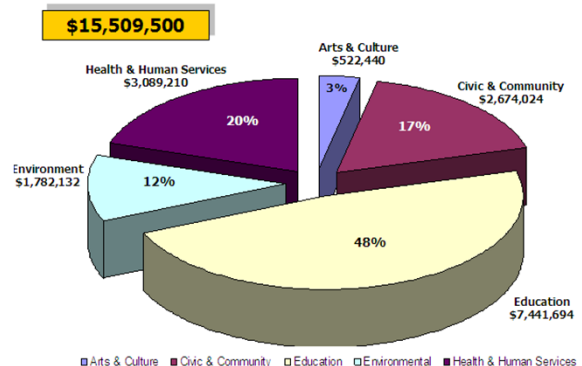
